#### Carlo Acutis:

- Created a multilingual website cataloging Eucharistic miracles.
- Born on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1991, he died at age 15 from leukemia in 2006; beatified in 2020 and canonized on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025.
- Known for deep Eucharistic devotion, techno-savvy evangelization, traveled exhibitions of relics.

#### Pier Giorgio Frassati:

- Born in 1901, died at age 24 in 1925 from polio; known for his extreme generosity-once gave his shoes to a barefoot child.
- Active in the St. Vincent de Paul Society, opposed fascism, and practiced joyful charity during mountain hikes and prayer.
- Beatified in 1990; canonized together with Carlo on 7th September 2025.

Together canonized on 7th September 2025 by Pope Leo XIV, these two young lay saints embody holiness for modern times. Carlo Acutis - "God's Influencer" - shared his faith online with authenticity and a love for the Eucharist. Pier Giorgio Frassati - "Man of the Beatitudes" - lived joyful charity in service of the poor. Their lives continue to inspire youth to live their faith fully today.

Canonization: Pope Leo XIV, 7th September 2025, St. Peter's Square, Vatican City.

- b) A teen was caught gaming excessively because parents didn't understand the platform.
- c) A girl faced cyber blackmail due to a lack of parental digital awareness.

- a) Parental education programs (workshops, short courses on cyber safety and digital tools).
- b) Community-based training(offered by NGOs, ICTA, religious institutions).
- c) Government support (making digital parenting part of PTA discussions).
- d) Private sector campaigns (telecoms promoting safe digital use).
- e) Family collaboration

#### The Way Forward:

The article argues that digital parenting is not just about controlling screen time or banning tech use. Instead, it's about guiding children to use technology wisely. If parents improve their digital literacy, they can act as a "compass" for their children in the digital world.





A Thanksgiving Holy Mass was offered in celebration of the birthday of the Very Rev. Fr. Rector. At the college chapel at 12.10 p.m.


#### 27th September - Aquinas Sports Fiesta 2025
